WEBINAR DESCRIPTIONS

The Nurtured Heart Approach®: An introduction to the Nurtured Heart Approach® (NHA), a relationship-focused methodology founded strategically in "The 3 Stands™" for helping children (and adults) build Inner Wealth™ and use their intensity in successful ways. Creating Safe and Affirming Families for Transgender and Gender Non-Conforming Youth: This webinar will educate resource parents and their families about basic terminology and concepts around transgender and gender non-conforming youth, allowing resource parents to create an accepting, affirming and inclusive home environment as transgender youth enter resource care. 3 hours in-service training

Social Emotional Learning and the Adolescent will focus on the development of the child at the adolescent level and their social emotional skills. We will explore ways parents can help support the adolescent to learn the skills associated with social awareness, relationship management, self-awareness, self-management and responsible decision-making. **2.5 in-service hours in-service training**

Post Adoption Issues: This webinar will help you understand the unique challenges you and your child face on the road ahead. We will look at the common questions, fears, and concerns adopted children have regarding their birth parents, adoptive families and peers. Special emphasis will be placed on the seven core issues of adoption and on strategies for dealing with ambiguous loss and grief and issues relating to self-esteem and identity. We will also discuss how feedback from peers and other adults can impact adoption adjustment. **2.0 hours in-service training**

Tech Dependence: Turned On and Tuned Out: The negative impact of technology dependence often impacts individuals, families and organizations in profoundly insidious ways. Based on instructor John Kriger, MSM, LCADC, CPS's newest book, this highly engaging course provides the most up-to-date research pertaining to internet behavior, relationships, virtual sex, bullying, and "tech-dependence". Learn the elements and indicators of abuse and dependence, and discover the potential negative impact of excessive computer use on the brain. Find out how behavior is being unwittingly modified, and the long-term cost to our health, organizations and society. Explore the hidden dangers in gaming, social networking, and alternative reality environments. Study methods to reengage learners and why so many are coming out of schools today unprepared to take their place in the work force. Discover techniques for offsetting social isolation, and what can be done to improve skills, increase social competencies, and better manage interpersonal relationships. **2.5 in-service training hours**

Understanding and Supporting LGBTQI Youth in Care: An introduction to the lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, questioning or queer, and intersex (LGBTQI) community. We will define sexual orientation and gender identity, and discuss societal, emotional and specific issues faced by LGBTQI youth. This course also offers practical advice on how resource parents can effectively provide LGBTQI youth with support and care . **2 in-service training hours**
